Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

There is a common expression: "It's always the darkest before dawn". As Mary made her way to the tomb 'very early on the first day of the week', it must have been dark indeed. Apart from the physical darkness that surrounded her, Mary was experiencing the inner darkness of sorrow and the terrible pain of grief. She felt not only the pain of loss for her friend Jesus, but the loss of all the hopes and dreams that he had promised of a better world, a world of peace and love, a world of mercy and forgiveness and above all the promise of eternal life. Yet, she had watched him suffer and die the shameful death of a criminal, abandoned and alone. It was very dark.

All of us have our moments of darkness - times when we felt our lives were falling apart, times of disappointment, or depression and loss. J R R Tolkien, the great English writer, whose works include "The Hobbit" and "The Lord of the Rings" once described the resurrection as a "eucatastrophe". A catastrophe is a disaster, a tragedy, an abject failure, but by adding "eu" before the word "catastrophe" its meaning becomes the very opposite.

Eucatastrophe is a reversal, a spectacular turn of events, a miracle; something neither expected nor dreamed of. Such was the resurrection of Jesus.

The suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus is the central mystery of our faith. As St Paul said a long time ago, "If Jesus is not raised from the dead, then our faith is useless".

One of the many ancient symbols used to describe the impact of Christian belief in the Resurrection was the phoenix. This beautiful bird symbolised hope and transformation of life after death. According to legend, only one phoenix could live at a time.

A Greek poet, writing in the eighth century B C, said the phoenix lived nine times longer than most other birds. When the phoenix felt death approaching, it built itself a pyre of wild cinnamon and died in the flames. But from the ashes there then arose a new phoenix, which tenderly encased its parent's remains in an egg of myrrh and flew with them to the Egyptian city of Heliopolis, where it laid them on the Altar of the Sun. These ashes were said to have the power of bringing a dead man back to life. In Christian art, the resurrected phoenix became a popular symbol of Christ risen from the grave.

During these Easter days let us ask the Risen Lord to renew our faith and deepen our hope and, in our prayers, let us:

look backward - to see Christ dying for us; look upward - to see Christ pleading for us; look inward - to see Christ living within us; look forward - to see Christ coming for us.

With all the peace and joy of the Risen Lord. Alleluia! Monsignor Colum.
